










	<p>Responsible Service Poster (A3): Offence for a juvenile to be in possession of liquor in a public place – OA 3919 Suitable for licensed venues – It is against the law for juveniles to be in possession of alcohol in a public place. Penalty of \$2,000.</p>	5	
	<p>Responsible Service Poster (A3): Possession or consumption of liquor by a juvenile – OA 3920 Suitable for licensed venues – It is against the law to allow possession or consumption of liquor by a juvenile on the premises. Penalty of \$10,000.</p>	5

	Responsible Service Poster (A3): False or misleading ID – OA 3921 Suitable for licensed venues – It is against the law to show false or misleading ID.	5	
	Responsible Service Poster (A3): Against the law to sell alcohol to a person under 18 years – OA 3922 Suitable for licensed venues – It is against the law for anyone to sell or supply alcohol to a person under 18 years of age.	5	
	Responsible Service Poster (A3): No Photo ID No Entry – OA 3923 Suitable for licensed venues – No Photo ID, no entry. Acceptable forms of ID.	5	
	Responsible Service Poster (A3): Help a drunk person obtain or consume alcohol on licensed premises or regulated premises – OA 3924 It is against the law to help a drunk person obtain or consume alcohol on licensed or regulated premises including penalties.	5	
	Responsible Service Poster (A3): Sell or supply liquor to a drunk person – Refusal of service – OA 3925 It is against the law to sell or supply alcohol to a person who is drunk.	5	
	Responsible Service Poster (A3): Sell or supply liquor to a drunk person – Definition of drunk – OA 3926 It is against the law to sell or supply liquor to a drunk person – speech, balance, coordination or behaviour appears to be noticeably impaired.	5	
	Responsible Service Poster (A3): Sell or supply liquor to a person who is drunk – Penalties - OA 3927 It is against the law to sell or supply alcohol to a person who is drunk including penalties.	5	
	Responsible Service Poster (A3): Failure to vacate the premises – OA 3928 Failure to comply with request to leave premises and vicinity is an offence. Penalty \$2,000.	5
